Management by Objectives: This concept was given by Peter.F.Drucker, according to him, the performance of an employee can be assessed on the basis of the targets achieved by him as set by the management of an organization. Firstly, the management sets the goals and communicate the same to the employees, and then the performance of an employee is compared against these set goals and is evaluated on this basis.
