"Prescription retinoids have a much higher concentration of the active ingredient, so they are readily available for the skin to use." Retinoids have been used for acne treatment for decades (tretinoin was approved over 40 years ago), but in recent years they've also been found to help fend off the signs of ageing.

Science of skincare: what are retinoids?

Topical retinoids approved for treatment of acne vulgaris are indicated only down to age 12 years, with the exception of tretinoin 0.05% gel (Atralin), which is approved for use in children as young as 10 years of age. But acne is a significant problem well before age 10, noted Dr. Baldwin. Data show that 78% of 9- to 10-year-old girls have acne.
